Final Conference Highlights:

The Final Conference of the T-Shirt project took place on November 15, at Casa do Professor's Auditorium, with more than 70 participants (school leaders, teachers and staff).

Focusing on the theme “The role of teachers in the deconstruction of gender stereotypes”, the Conference gave the opportunity to the project partners to present all the achievements of the project in their countries. During the Conference, the participants were presented and invited to register on the T-SHIRT E-learning platform, which is the final output of the project. The platform is available in four languages and is addressed to elementary/primary school teachers who want to work on gender equality issues in the classroom.



The **online training course** is composed of seven modules:

- International, European and national policies for gender equality
- Feminist research about education and gender
- Biological and social gender – gender identities and discrimination
- The role of gender stereotypes in society
- Education and gender inequalities: the composition of the teaching population according to gender
- Teachers and gender: assumptions, expectations and practices
- The role of teachers in the deconstruction of stereotypes
